

# SCF's Workforce Development Courses Today Train for Jobs in the Future

It was a busy day at State College of Florida, Sarasota-Manatee (SCF). Terri Clark took the time to speak with us anyway. That's not unusual. For Ms. Clark, every day is a busy

day. She serves dual duties as SCF's dean of lifelong learning and workforce development. What's the difference? Sometimes very little. Sometimes none. The line between life and work is pretty thin these days. SCF's curriculum reflects that.

The workforce classes at SCF address the changing demands of mod-

Ms. Clark notes that 21st-century careers have evolved at warp speed. "There are tremendous needs in the technology and health care fields, and those needs have been accelerated by the pandemic," she says. "We are committed to training students to fill those roles in our local workforce."

The situation is analogous to Alice's predicament in "Through the Looking Glass." In today's career world, you have to run as fast as you can just to stay in the same place.

For contemporary workers, SCF provides solutions for time-strapped individuals who feel stuck on this accelerating treadmill. It offers options for part-time learning, evening and weekend classes, flexible start dates and

instructional methods that include in-person, self-paced online and online live instruction

#### Workers of Tomorrow and Today

SCF offers a wide spectrum of industry certification training options "These can open doors for those currently outside the workforce," Ms. Clark says. "These credentials also empower workers trying to keep up with changes in their existing fields — or take a step up to another career altogether."

Technology courses are especially popular. SCF offers high-tech training in a host of job-related software programs. Its Coding Academy boot camp explores the operating systems that run these programs.

"Workers graduate from our 'boot camp' with an industry certification and a job waiting for them in the area," Ms. Clark says. "Students can also apply that certificate toward their college credit hours."

# Putting Down Roots

# Wellen Park Residents and Friends Join in on Community Planting Day

Wellen Park residents, employees and community members dug into the task of planting hundreds of saplings around the 80-acre Grand Lake during Community Tree Planting Day on Sept. 15.

A mix of long leaf, slash and loblolly pine along with some bald cypress was selected to enhance the aesthetic look of the future Downtown Wellen area. The trees will also provide shade along the community's trails, offer habitat to wildlife and increase the state's pine population.

"When we do things like this as a community, it shows a lack of selfishness because you're doing something that will really benefit others in the long-term future," says Rick Severance, president of Wellen Park.

Mr. Severance and his staff were among the 75 volunteers who dug holes, added soil enhancers, planted the saplings and watered the new plantings.

"It was very rewarding and satisfying," he says of the experience. "When you give back to the community that you are helping to create, it shows that you're invested in the small things. And a lot of the small things make up the large things."

Wellness is a major focus of Wellen Park. This includes giving residents opportunities to connect with one another, take care of themselves and pursue a healthy and active lifestyle.

"This day gave people a chance to meet people who weren't in their neighborhood

but were part of Wellen Park overall," Mr. Severance says. "I loved getting to know these people and hearing their personal stories about why they moved to Wellen Park."

Mr. Severance says the volunteers included

a resident who just moved to Wellen Park and was looking to meet new friends, two nurses who enjoyed a day outdoors, an HR manager with a national retailer who brought her young family out to enjoy the day, and a group of eight friends and family from IslandWalk who routinely find volunteer opportunities to participate in.



The planting crew worked hard for four hours but also enjoyed refreshments and shade in the volunteer tent, as well as a group lunch following the tree planting.

Although most of what they planted were saplings, some trees about 7-feet-tall were added to create some variation in height.

"It looks phenomenal," Mr. Severance says. "It will be interesting to see what these trees will look like in two years. In some cases, the saplings can grow as much as 3 feet per year."

The Community Tree Planting Day was

the latest tree-focused initiative Wellen Park has undertaken. Its Heritage Tree Program begun earlier this year is a nearly \$1 million effort to relocate 26 healthy live oak trees, ranging from 14 to 96 inches in diameter, from various spots within the community to Downtown Wellen. Not only will the decades-old trees help establish an immediate sense of place, but they'll also remove thousands of pounds of carbon dioxide from the air each year, generate oxygen and minimize rainwater runoff.

"Every time we make an investment," Mr. Severance says, "we understand there's a return. Sometimes it's monetary and sometimes it isn't, but it's the right thing to do for the community."





# Coming to Wellen Park Luxury Apartment Living for Seniors



retirees alike.

SCF's workforce training expands possibilities for students and retirees alike. Lifelong learning opportunities in performing arts, computer basics and arboriculture are among classes that find an audience in all age groups. The college is adding new offerings all the time, and there is always an eye on the job market when determining where to expand.

Ms. Clark compares the school's many offerings to an airport hub. "It depends on your destination, she says. "A student can apply their credit hours towards their associate degree at a state college. Mid-career graduates can apply it to their current jobs or their next job. You can also learn for the love of learning and not apply it to your career. Where you want to go with it is entirely up to you."

And what if you don't know where you want to go?

Each student in SCF's workforce training program gets a success coach. The college has a team of success coaches to guide students through academic challenges and career exploration. Many students, especially those attending college for the first time, are still considering options ranging from earning an Associate in Arts degree and transferring to a university or looking for a fast springboard into a career "They examine goals, options and obstacles to overcome. It's not a one-and-done talk. The success coach follows each student throughout their tenure at SCE"00

# **Keeping Your Pets Safe During the Holidays**

The holiday season is here, and many pet parents plan to include their furry companions in the festivities. During the holiday season, starting with Halloween and ending with New Year's Day, it is important to try to keep your pet's eating and exercise habits as close to their normal routine as possible.



**Halloween** can be particularly spooky for our furry children. The best Halloween plan for your furry friend is "no tricks, no treats." Leave your pet at home if trick or treating. If you do choose to take your furry friend out, costumes should be loose enough to provide freedom of movement and not interfere with vision or hearing. If your pet stays home, the constant doorbell and strangers in weird costumes can be too much for them. Pets should stay away from candy and their wrappers, caramel apples as well — these treats or snacks can lead to intestinal upsets, GI blockages, and pancreatitis.





**Thanksgiving** and pets go hand in hand — aren't you forever thankful you have your furry friend? Before the celebration begins let's ensure your Thanksgiving festivities will be as pet friendly as possible. Since Thanksqiving is largely about food, remember not all people foods are safe for pets. Turkey should be cooked, boneless and given in a small amount. Do not feed bones or skin — dogs and cats have a difficult time processing fatty foods like turkey skin and it can lead to GI injury. Some pies and cakes include harmful ingredients like xylitol, which can be fatal to your furry friend. Chocolate can be harmful to both dogs and cats and cause vomiting, diarrhea and seizures.

**Christmas** is a favorite for pets, there's usually a present from Santa under the tree for them. Here's some helpful hints to keep Christmas fun, safe and enjoyable for all. Anchor your tree so it doesn't tip and fall. Many cats like to climb them. Also, stagnant water can make our pets sick so keeping them from drinking the live tree water is important. Avoid mistletoe and holly. Both can cause nausea, vomiting, diarrhea and some cardiovascular issues. Lilies can cause kidney failure in cats so keep them away from the pretty flowers. Tinsel is a shiny toy for cats but ingesting it can lead to an obstructed digestive tract, dehydration and severe vomiting. Keep wires from the Christmas tree clear and contained so animals don't chew on them. We like to share our foods with our pets during the Christmas season. It is their holiday too after all but keep many of the foods (just like Thanksgiving) away from them. Instead, pick special treats for them — chew toys, kongs, stuffed catnip toy or a cat dancer.





New Year's Day is fun for most, but sometimes not for your furry friend. Strings and thrown confetti can get lodged in a cat's intestines. Noisy poppers can frighten noise sensitive dogs and cats. Many pets are also afraid of fireworks, so be sure to secure your pet in a safe and escape proof area to hide when close to midnight. When dealing with any get together during the holidays remember that some florals are harmful to pets. When in doubt use artificial flowers. Some pets become shy or protective when it's a full house so sometimes putting them in a quiet room away from the action is the best solution.


may enjoy and view the artwork on site, as well as purchase pieces to take home.







# Step Back into Elegant Old Florida at Historic Boca Grande

Boca Grande or Gasparilla Island, playground of presidents and celebrities, lies about a 30-minute ride and a \$6 toll from Wellen Park, making it the perfect day trip for residents and their out-of-town guests. And although the island has played host to the George H. W. Bush family, Thomas Edison, Henry Ford, Audrey Hepburn and others, it manages to maintain its small town, laid-back charm.

The fishing here is great and has been attracting visitors for more than 100 years. Boca Grande is known as the tarpon capital of the world. Strictly a catch and release event, tarpon fishing is not for the faint of heart. The tarpon, known as the silver king, is a difficult creature to hook and hang onto but an experienced captain can help even novice anglers. Tarpon run from April to October, but the best fishing is during April and May. Book a trip with a captain out of one of the island's several marinas, including Whidden's Marina, on the National Register of Historic Places.

Boca Grande's white sand beaches are famous among shell collectors and there are two old lighthouses to explore. Gasparilla Island State Park on the south end of the island is home to one of them. Admission to the park is cash only and based on the honor system.

Originally known as the Gasparilla Island Light Station, the Port Boca Grande Lighthouse is the oldest structure on the island and has operated since 1890. It is home to a museum that opened in 1999 and is open to visitors from 11 a.m.-3 p.m., Tuesday

through Saturday and is closed Sunday and Monday, as well as during the month of August and on major holidays.

The museum covers cultural and social history of the area dating from 12,000 B.C. to the present. It contains a nature room featuring a "please touch" area with local

bones, fossils and shells. The museum gift shop offers souvenirs, local artwork and jewelry. All proceeds from the gift shop and donations to the museum directly support the lighthouse, local state parks, Gasparilla, Cayo Costa, Don Pedro and Stump Pass, and educational programs.

Bring your bike along when you visit and cycle the picturesque 6.5-mile path that runs the length of the island.

The quaint town offers plenty of shopping and restaurant fare. Or pick up a picnic lunch at one of the local grocers. A popular lunch stop is the Pink Elephant, which is affiliated



# Cleaning Up Coastal Waters Is Focus of Local Volunteers

Tangles of fishing line. Barnacle-encrusted crab traps. Bait buckets. Tires.

PVC pipe. A drone.

For more than 20 years, scuba divers and other volunteers with the Suncoast Reef Rovers have removed a laundry list of lost, abandoned and discarded debris from the waters of Venice's popular Gulf of Mexico destinations. Mangled fishing rods and gear wedged in the rocks of the North and South Jetties. Beach chairs and umbrellas resting 18 feet below on the ocean floor. A water-logged beanbag chair.

"We're kind of like the small dive club that can," says Ken Lackmann, a longtime member who dove with the volunteers before assuming the duties of underwater debris cleanup events coordinator 11 years ago. "We provide environmental aid and coastal stewardship. If this debris was left year after year, it would end up snagging the sea life and creatures living in these habitats."

The Reef Rovers conduct five to six annual underwater cleanups, each requiring a cadre of scuba divers, snorkelers, kayakers, shore-based helpers. It is a herculean effort to coordinate. Mr. Lackmann has to factor in early-morning slack tides coinciding with nonholiday weekends — usually only a handful a year — plus diver-friendly warm water temperatures and other variables as unpredictable as the weather.

Although the Reef Rovers number only 38 paid members, their cleanups attract a

growing number of volunteers — families, father-and-daughter dive teams, high school students, Girl Scout troops, environmental groups, email recipients, Facebook followers and tourists heeding the call for help.

"More people are asking to help out," Mr. Lackmann says. "The more eyes and helpers we can have, the more underwater trash we can bring up."

A North Jetty cleanup in September drew 51 volunteers, including 25 divers, three police boats and assistance from Sea Tow Venice, which donates the mechanical muscle and the technology to hoist the heaviest

"If we had 50 divers, we still wouldn't have enough," Mr. Lackmann says. "Sometimes the visibility is only two to three feet which is difficult when you're looking through rocks."

It all adds up — 862 pounds of trash collected during the recent North Jetty cleanup, an average of 500 to 800 pounds per event, up to six times a year over 20 years.

"If it weren't for the Reef Rovers the north and south jetties of Venice, which are popular with tourists, would be very littered and very hazardous," says Ronda Ryan, director of Sarasota Bay Watch which participates. "Abandoned fishing gear and nets will ruin the habitat and decrease the amount of fish there. By cleaning and maintaining these areas, they're ensuring a healthy fish population in a heavily visited tourist area.'

During the September dive, the group

removed 146 pounds of steel, 142 pounds of fishing line, 113 pounds of nets, 80 pounds of lead, 75 pounds of miscellany, 72 pounds of tires, 55 pounds of rope, and numerous other items. All collected in an area about the length of a football field.

It's true what they say about another man's junk. Sarasota Bay Watch sifts through the debris, recycling, reusing and repurposing items for educational outreach. The nonprofit fashioned a mermaid from nets, lines, lures, buoys and other derelict fishing gear.

"We have a spectacular relationship with the Reef Rovers," says Ms. Ryan. "They're a very strong, enthusiastic group who are laser-focused at what they do. They're very knowledgeable about local conditions and

the troublesome sites."

The group also accommodates special requests. Members have repositioned Venice Beach swim buoys moved by storms, cleaned up the waters around Higel Park, the Venice Yacht Club and the marina at the Crow's Nest Bar & Grill — places where current and conditions aren't conducive to retrieving something accidentally dropped overboard.

While they'll continue to expand their base of volunteers and cleanups, the group is the process of creating an artificial reef snorkelers and divers can visit just off the beach. And just like the Reef Rovers' cleanups, the project will extend to the community.

"We want to involve middle and high school kids in the actual design," says Mr. Lackmann who plans to retire by then. "We want them to figure out the best patterns for 75 to 100 reef balls. The winner will get a cash award, free diving lessons and their name on one of the artificial reef balls."

Manasota Key and close to the Venice Art Center where they're members. Carol has started golf, Geoff plans to learn soon.


"We love going to the theaters in Sarasota," he says. "In New York City, it was a chore. It required a plan. Here, it's just an easy drive. We have the best of everything."

# Howling at the Moon Annual Run Raises Cash and Spirits

For several years, Angela Stinnett manned the sidelines of Bocca Lupo's annual Howl at the Moon 5K run. This year she ran it.

"I've been with the company almost seven years and have always been working through the restaurant," says Ms. Stinnett, a manager at the Wellen Park restaurant. "This was the first year I had the chance to run. It was my first time ever running a 5K."

Ms. Stinnett was among the record turnout for this year's Oct. 1 race, its ninth and the first in Wellen Park. The 8:30 p.m. starting gun sent a sea of more than 460 runners on a course from Bocca Lupo to CoolToday Park and back. It marked a triumphant return for a beloved community event that was cancelled last year and was a little iffy for a 2021 return. Howl at the Moon and a golf tournament the following day raise money for the Jessica Costanzo Scholarship Fund, founded by Mark and Marguerite Costanzo in honor of their 23-year-old daughter killed in a car accident in 2014.

"Our whole company comes out and supports our partner Mark," says David Valentino, who co-owns the family-run Bocca Lupo with his brother Dennis Valentino and Mr. Costanzo. "It's a very important weekend for our company. With so many races being cancelled the past year, we weren't sure if we would be able to do it or if there would be much response. The response was tremendous, it exceeded our expectations and shows another way that life is returning to normal."

Runners hailed from nearby cities, others from as far away as Michigan, Ohio, Illinois, even California, and included a 4-year-old who walked with his mom and a Fort Myers runner celebrating his 90th birthday the following day. Ian Walsh of Bradenton won the male overall division in 19:41; North

Port's own Olivia Bonevento was the fastest female finish just shy of 27 minutes and ninth in the field. Ms. Stinnett finished 317th, an accomplishment she's proud of.

"It was great to see the turnout and to see everyone again," says Stinnett. "I know the kids the scholarships go to. My daughter works at the restaurant and is college-age. It's nice to know this scholarship is available to her. This race really goes back to being part of the community especially now when we need it the most."

Howl at the Moon started 10 years ago as a play on "bocca lupo," Italian for mouth of the wolf, and has been held in Englewood and recently at Charlotte Sports Park. The 2021 race was moved to Wellen Park - and paved roadways - to celebrate the restaurant's newest location, which opened in April 2020. The golf tournament was added six years ago.

"My wife got into running and dragged me into it 10 years ago," says Mr. Valentino. re participating in 5Ks and fun runs

and thought it would be wonderful to host our own as another way to be part of the community."

The 5K and the golf tournament have raised over \$100,000 and have awarded 23 full scholarships to students attending Epiphany Cathedral School, Venice High School and Webber International University - Ms. Costanzo's alma maters. Bocca Lupo also awards three employee scholarships, one earmarked for those pursuing a culinary degree or a career in the restaurant business.

With its late start time, after-run party at Bocca Lupo, deejay and beer truck, Howl at the Moon differs from most races. "Most 5Ks are in the morning and any runner will tell you people go home after the races," says Mr.

> Valentino. "I think the party is the point for our runners. I'd say 90 percent stayed for the party.'

> > This year, Howl at the Moon enlisted the help of race organizer My Favorite Race Events and its race director Tracy Hussey who's been involved with previous runs.

"It's a challenge to put on a race of this size," Mr. Valentino says. "Tracy brought us sponsorships, took care of logistics, permits and mapped out the course. I got the fun part; I got to serve pizza and beer.

Mr. Hussey offered his services for free. "I always do one race a year as a give back to the community and can't think of a better one than Howl at the Moon," he says. "My company didn't take a dime, so all of the net proceeds go to my dear friends the Costanzos and David Valentino. They do a lot of great things for the community.'

My Favorite Race Event also organized the half-marathon/5K at CoolToday Park.

Howl at the Moon complements Bocca Lupo's long-time support of the community. The restaurants host Pizza for a Cause every

Tuesday night, donating a portion of the entire proceeds from food, alcohol, dine in and dine out sales at all three locations to that night's local charity, schools or community groups. Interested groups can sign up on the restaurant's website.

"It's important for us to be part of the community," says Mr. Valentino. "We opened the Wellen Park restaurant at the worst possible time and for the first nine months were under one level of restriction or another. We were frightened. The welcome we received and the community support gives me goosebumps. We were one of the first restaurants in Wellen Park. People identify their community by the small businesses in it. Every little community has their own local food and pizza is very local, microlocal. Now we're fully open and mobbed every day. The Wellen Park restaurant is every bit as successful as the others. We belong to the Wellen Park community."


## Arts and Cultural Alliance Is Alive and Well

Jim Shirley has been the director of the Arts and Cultural Alliance of Sarasota County since 2006. In that role he works to pro-

mote artistic endeavors in the community and in the schools. Although it was a challenging year, arts organizations showed their creativity by entertaining the public in new and different ways. They developed new and ingenious ways to carry on — virtual



and outdoor performances and concerts in parks all over the community.

And Mr. Shirley had a hand in making that happen,
"We are the only official arts agency to be

we are the only official arts agency to be recognized by statute," Mr. Shirley says. "We are not a county agency but an independent 501c3, eligible to receive money from such sources as specialty license plate sales; with that we are able to bestow grants."

The source of this grant money is the bed tax; one-half of each penny is designated for

the arts, or more specifically, to be shared with arts groups that attract tourists. How much can those half-pennies add up? Mr. Shirley reports that last year the Alliance distributed \$2 million in grants.

Two million dollars — compiled one half-penny at a time.

The alliance is member-powered and advocates for arts and culture in Sarasota County. It was founded in 1986 and has administered more than \$26 million in grants to area artists an and arts organizations.

The organization works to make sure that arts and culture remain a priority so this vibrant, creative community continues to flourish. Alliance staff achieves this through advocacy, education and community outreach.

Mr. Shirley's position with the Alliance

allows him to speak to officials like members of the Board of County Commissioners, for example, not just as Citizen Shirley but as the voice of 5,000 alliance members.

And thanks to those voices, Sarasota County will continue to remain the arts hub of Florida.



One proposed menu item is crispy duck breast, crispy fried salt-and-pepper rice noodles, and sweet and sour zucchini with hoisin sauce. Another is horseradish panko-crusted swordfish, Old Bay potato pancake, Bloody Mary broth, and mustard aioli with a microcilantro-celery leaf garnish.

A fun idea is the Porterhouse "steak-cuterie" board for two featuring grilled porterhouse, Tuscan tomato bread salad, grilled asparagus, Caesar wedges, pickled cherry peppers,

figs, chimichurri and bleu cheese butter.

A highlight of the Salty Bull will be its fullservice raw bar bursting with oysters, shrimp, crab legs and much more. It will be placed front and center as people enter, sure to whet appetites as guests arrive.

Similar to Irma's, the Salty Bull will have a concrete bar top. There will be tile façade at the bar and a huge liquor display reaching from the bar top to the ceiling, including a temperature-controlled wine storage enclosure. Expect high-end wines, cocktails, whiskeys and bourbons.

Mr. Villani said the decor will be upscale but not white tablecloth, with white brick walls, restored wood tables, and an eclectic mix of leather chairs and booths.

"When people go out, they want a memorable experience in an on-trend, contemporary atmosphere."

The dining room will seat about 80 to 100, with seating outside for about 50 and at the bar for 20.

Opening is anticipated in the fourth quarter of 2022 or beginning of 2023.

## The Arts Are Back Making music again with the Venice Symphony

Intermission is over!

After an 18-month pause, the Venice Symphony returns to the stage Nov. 19-20 with the entire lineup of guest artists originally booked for the lost season — 2020-21. It's an impressive feat given the backlog of missed concert dates; musicians and managers are scrambling to reschedule as music returns to the masses.

"It's a 100-to-one longshot to get all of our guest artists from last year's season," says Venice Symphony conductor and music director Troy Quinn, now in his third season. "They're all excited to come to Venice and perform. I've been talking to (world-renowned piper) Eric Rigler about his concert for two years now and it's going to feel like a wonderful reunion when he's here. We're eager to make music again."

The 2021-22 season, the orchestra's 47th, showcases classical music with the modern-day nuances of Broadway, Hollywood, plus genre-spanning homages to "Game of Thrones" and the DC and Marvel comics universe, personally selected by the young conductor.

"We're combining genres this season," says Mr. Quinn. "I get to be pretty adventurous in programming. There's a variety of enlightening and entertaining selections, something for everyone. It's going to be a great season."

Performing at the 1,089-seat Venice Performing Arts Center, the Venice Symphony typically plays to sold out audiences. For its 2019-20 season, which was cut short by the worldwide pandemic, it boasted 1,800 sub-

scribers to four concerts and sold out 16 of the 17 concerts.

"We are excited for the community to know we're back and their seats are waiting for them," says Christine Kasten, president and CEO. "Based on our ticket sales, we see that people are ready to come back."

The new season opens with "Brahms and the Boys," featuring Thomas Hooten, "one

of the greatest trumpeters of our times," says Mr. Quinn. It continues through April with jaunts to comic land, La La Land, winter wonderland and Scotland.







## Local Artists Richard Krevolin and Michele Moore Show at Welcome Center

#### Renaissance Man

Someone who is outstanding at several different things, especially those considered to be artistic, is often referred to as a Renaissance man or woman. Richard Krevolin makes other Renaissance men look like shirkers. Though he didn't pick up a brush until he was more than 50 years old, once he did, he created art that ranged in style from abstract to realist. His offerings are fascinating and

varied, as you'll see by stopping by the Wellen Park Welcome Center where he has several pieces on exhibit.

First working in oil on canvas, Mr. Krevolin has more recently been working with acrylics using brushes, socks, fingers — not kidding. You can see him in action on his Facebook page and as a bonus you'll meet his darling rescue terrier, Honey.

In the same video he's also poking around the world of NFTs with an art dealer friend. An NFT is a unit of data, stored digitally, that certifies a digital asset to be unique and therefore not interchangeable. NFTs can be used to represent items such as photos, videos, audio, and other types of digital files. If you are trying to wrap your head around that concept, you might find some insights in their discussion.

In addition to possessing a healthy amount of innate talent, Mr. Krevolin is well educated — graduating first from Yale, then earning a master's degree from the UCLA School of Cinema and Television and one in playwriting

and cinema from USC. Sharing his wisdom with his students has resulted in some fine major films from them.

Mr. Krevolin is the writer/director/producer

of and actor in the PBS documentary "Making Light in Terezin," an unusual offering which IMDb describes thus: "This documentary highlights the role that theater played in World War II through interviews with survivors and an in-depth look at the need for laughter in times of trauma." It is available to stream on plex.tv, tubitv.com or Prime Video.

A raw-cut sample of his part in "Hotel Cal-

ifornia," can be found on his Facebook page, www.facebook.com/richard.krevolin (July 14 post).

He also co-wrote and directed "Attachments," a feature length comedy starring Katherine Ross. His plays have been produced around the world, and he still teaches playwriting at the Venice Theatre in addition to working as a story consultant, script doctor, brand narrative coach and does art and murals on commission



#### **Creating Can Be Healing**

Artist Michele Moore is also featured at the Welcome Center. Raised in Miami, she relocated to North Port in 2005. Despite the fact that that she is a talented artist, it wasn't the art scene that drew her to this coast. It was the great fishing. She is an angler at heart.

Within 10 months after she moved here her mom joined her in North Port, where she lived until she died in 2017, throwing Ms. Moore into an inconsolable state of grief. In addition, her husband Phil was battling PTSD following his military service. He also deals with color blindness, something that hampers his artistic bent.

When Ms. Moore quit smoking, she was seeking something calming that would help her get through her trials. That was when the couple began taking evening classes at the North Port Art Center. They were delighted to





discover not only the joy but the remarkable healing power in the creation of art.

"Keeping busy is key," Ms. Moore says. And she certainly practices what she preaches — in addition to creating commissioned pieces, running her own business and

in North Port Art Center that she now works there part-time as its out-

reach coordinator.

For the first time, she really looked at the doodles and drawings she'd rather mindlessly created in the past and recognized that her artistic soul had been hiding just below the surface for quite some time. Leaving the banking industry after 10 years may have allowed her to change her focus to something that had been there, but

buried, all along. She credits the North Port Art Center and its excellent, encouraging teachers for fully awakening her artistic instincts.

While you're probably familiar with most of these disciplines, bone jewelry might be new to you; Ms. Moore accepts bird, fish and animal bones from various sources and recycles all or small parts of them into unusual jewelry.

"Everyone has the ability to make a mark," she says matter-of-factly, "and that's what art is, making marks. You just have to recognize that and have the courage to make that first mark."

Her abilities now awakened, Ms. Moore has discovered many ways to express it: In 2020 the North Port Art Center exposed her to "pen pastel" work — an enjoyable and slightly less costly method than working with regular pastels. She took classes with two of the center's instructors, Laura Pommier and Barbara Archer-Baldwin.

She particularly enjoys creating portraits of her beloved dogs, Chauncey and Major.

She also is designing and making bone jewelry, painting, sketching, drawing and creating photographs. Her photography has now led her into cinematography.

While most art and jewelry lovers are probably familiar with most of these disciplines, bone jewelry might be something new. Ms. Moore accepts bird, fish and animal bones from various sources and recycles all or small parts of them into unusual jewelry, with a somewhat lacev effect — earrings, necklaces, bracelets and more.

"Being creative every day is the only way to get better," says Ms. Moore. "Whether your art is — baking or painting or sewing or sculpting — whatever it is that moves you, do it every day."

The art of Ms. Moore and Mr. Krevolin are on display now for browsing and for purchase at the Welcome Center.


